THIS IS LESSON 2, IN CONCERT C MAJOR. THESE EXERCISES WILL EXPLORE THREE DIATONIC MELODIES IN THE KEY OF CONCERT C MAJOR. EACH MELODY WILL BE PLAYED THROUGH THE BASIC DIATONIC CHORDS, I MAJOR, II MINOR, III MINOR, IV MAJOR, V DOM 7, VI MINOR, VII MINOR 7 FLAT 5.
